CHORAL DIRECTORSHIP COURSE 2015

The Choral Directorship Course has been offered since 2002. It alternates between a focus on mixed voice choirs and the more mature voice, and a specific focus on school music and teachers working with elementary age children. It is our pleasure to offer the latter program again in 2015. The course offers an introduction to the basics of conducting, vocal pedagogy, choral and personal skills. It will also be found to be a useful opportunity to review fundamentals for slightly more experienced conductors whose batteries need recharging.

The upcoming course is open to conductors of children's community choirs, but it is specifically focused on those offering music within the school system. We hope particularly to reach those specialists who have music training, but do not necessarily have specific knowledge of dealing with children's voices. Specific topics covered are likely to include:

- basic vocal physiology
- > appropriate ranges for different age groups
- breath support and techniques for developing that support
- development of the head voice
- choosing appropriate repertoire
- what defines 'good/excellent' repertoire...what do I look for?
- singing in parts canons, partner songs, two-part repertoire
- the role of the accompanist
- organizing for the choir (short-term and long-term)
- what to do in the first rehearsal
- making rehearsals "fun", productive and musically successful
- getting the whole body involved
- ideas for involving and engaging boys
- what to do when elementary aged boys' voices begin to change
- > sitting or standing when to do what
- useful (but simple) conducting gestures
- age appropriate exemplars of individual and group performance

Participants will be expected to take an assessment of their conducting skills with a faculty member; this takes place in two 20-minute sessions, and is included in registration.

Registrants will receive daily group voice instruction, specific topic sessions with a variety of experienced faculty members, and a day spent at a reading clinic (elementary music focus), as well as other sessions on repertoire.
